Shortlanesend School Nursery Rhymes: A Rhyme a Week




Each week the children will enjoy learning a new rhyme in school linked to our half termly topic.

Shortlanesend School Poems: A Poem a Day




Each day, we will share a poem a day from the book, "I am the seed that grew the tree."



EYFS Reception: Repetitive Books


All books are excellent tools for encouraging language development. Predictable and repetitive children's books are great for children with language disorders and those who have childhood apraxia of speech (CAS) or other speech-sound disorders. The repetitive nature of these books reduces the "cognitive load," allowing the child to focus on comprehension (language) and production (articulation) of the content. Books provide new vocabulary in context, provide visuals to help aid in comprehension, and can be used to address a variety of skills depending on how they are used: receptive language, expressive language, articulation skills, and fluency.


















